President's Report

In the last couple of months we have continued with zoom broadcasts of worship service in addition to in person services in the sanctuary. We are averaging 35 attending in person and 40+ contacts on zoom and phone. We have required face coverings, temperature monitoring, hand sanitizing, 6 foot distancing and contact tracking in the sanctuary. Those attending have been compliant with regulations including congregational singing or vocal choir. We do need volunteers to assist with the service...technicians for computer and camera, ushers, greeters to take temperatures and sign in guests. Anyone who is interested will be trained. Please contact the office if you can assist. We will need additional help for Thanksgiving and Christmas eve worship.

The Covid task force and executive council drafted a procedure for funeral services at St. Stephen's. No viewings will be held in the building at the present time. 40 guests as designated by the family will be welcome in the sanctuary for a service with the same procedures as for all in person gatherings.

Meetings are being held in the narthex for church committees and bible study. No outside agencies are meeting in the church with the exception of the blood bank.

Plans are being made for Christmas services.

The Transition team is meeting.

A Task force is working on cleaning procedures such as purchase of a fogger and with help from worship and music the distribution of communion.

The contract for the interim pastor is being extended for 6 months. The initial contract expires on January 6, 2021.

A Message From The Transition Team

Greetings from the Transition Team! There are five members on the St Stephen's transition team: Charlotte Koch, Julie Leinhauser, Ray Shipley, Mark Tiger and Ron Wos, with discussion facilitated by Pastor Gwen King. The six of us have gathered three times now, since late August to begin to discuss the transition of our church leadership and the direction in which the church is headed.

The work of the Transition Team will culminate in the creation of a document called the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) which will tell the story of St. Stephen's and will be submitted to the SEPA Synod. This profile will reflect on five focus points:

- 1. Heritage- Reviewing how St Stephen's has been shaped and formed
- Leadership- Reviewing the membership needs and its ways of organizing and developing new and effective leadership
- 3. Mission- defining and redefining our sense of purpose and direction
- 4. Connections- discovering all the relationships the faith community of St Stephen's builds outside its membership
- 5. Future- developing congregational and pastoral profiles

The MSP will also help answer the questions – Who are we? Who is our neighbor? What is God calling us to be and do?

In our first few meetings we discussed who we Team members are personally, and who we are in the church. With that information established, the Team began to discuss who we are as a congregation.

We have begun by discussing heritage and leadership. In order to find out where we are going, the transition team is studying what our church has done in the past 50+ years. It is only in reflecting on the past that we are able to learn from our successes and oversights.

In writing this article, we reflect on the text of a hymn recently sung during worship, "Lead me, guide me along the way, For if you lead me I cannot stray. Lord, let me walk each day with Thee. Lead me, oh Lord lead me." Every step of the way the Transition Team is looking to be guided by God, and searching for God's will and direction for our congregation. Please keep the Transition Team and our congregation in your prayers.




